

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Running Our Business

Our Board Members are responsible for providing leadership to Eildon by helping to develop and oversee our strategic vision.

Eildon is driven by four values; Caring, Committed, **Connected** and **Creative**. These values are the 'Golden Thread' that runs through our Corporate Planning Framework.

Our Board meets nine times a year, and Board Members are also asked to attend additional committee meetings, and a residential strategic planning event. Most meetings take place in the early evening.

When accepted onto our Board, we provide a full induction and on-going training. Board membership is voluntary, but you will be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses.
